



- 1. Formulate your topic.
- 2. Create a table of contents for your text.
- 3. Make a list of various search terms that describe the topic (the individual points in the contents).
- 4. Search for relevant literature in the search platform ETH Library @ swisscovery
 - Make sure to also use the keywords and bibliographies from documents related to your topic.
 - Note down the search queries so that you can enter them again later.
- 5. Use the filter and sort functions in the left column to limit the search if you have a long result list OR get more results using a truncation search (*) if the result list is too short.
- 6. Order the relevant documents and assess the information they contain.
