

## Activities for students during Flipped Classroom – Examples

A few examples of student activities during the three flipped classroom phases (**before**, **during** and **after** the classroom phase) are provided below.

## Before the classroom phase

Before the classroom phase students familiarise themselves with fundamental content, concepts and terminology and then check their knowledge via self-tests. One advantage is that diverging levels of previous knowledge may be evened out, and misconceptions addressed.

## **During the classroom phase**

In the classroom students consolidate their new knowledge by addressing realistic, applicationoriented problems, projects and research themes.

Exercises, experiments	Simple models / draft designs (paper, wood etc.)	Little

Formative assessments (to check learning status)	Classroom Assessment Techniques (CATs)	Little
	Paper or electronic "voting" (apps): Clicker/EduApp, Kahoot, other	Medium
	Tests or quizzes (Moodle, other)	Medium

## After the classroom phase

Experience shows that consistent repetition and consolidation of acquired knowledge via additional assignments help to stabilise new competences sustainably and foster awareness of the "big picture".
