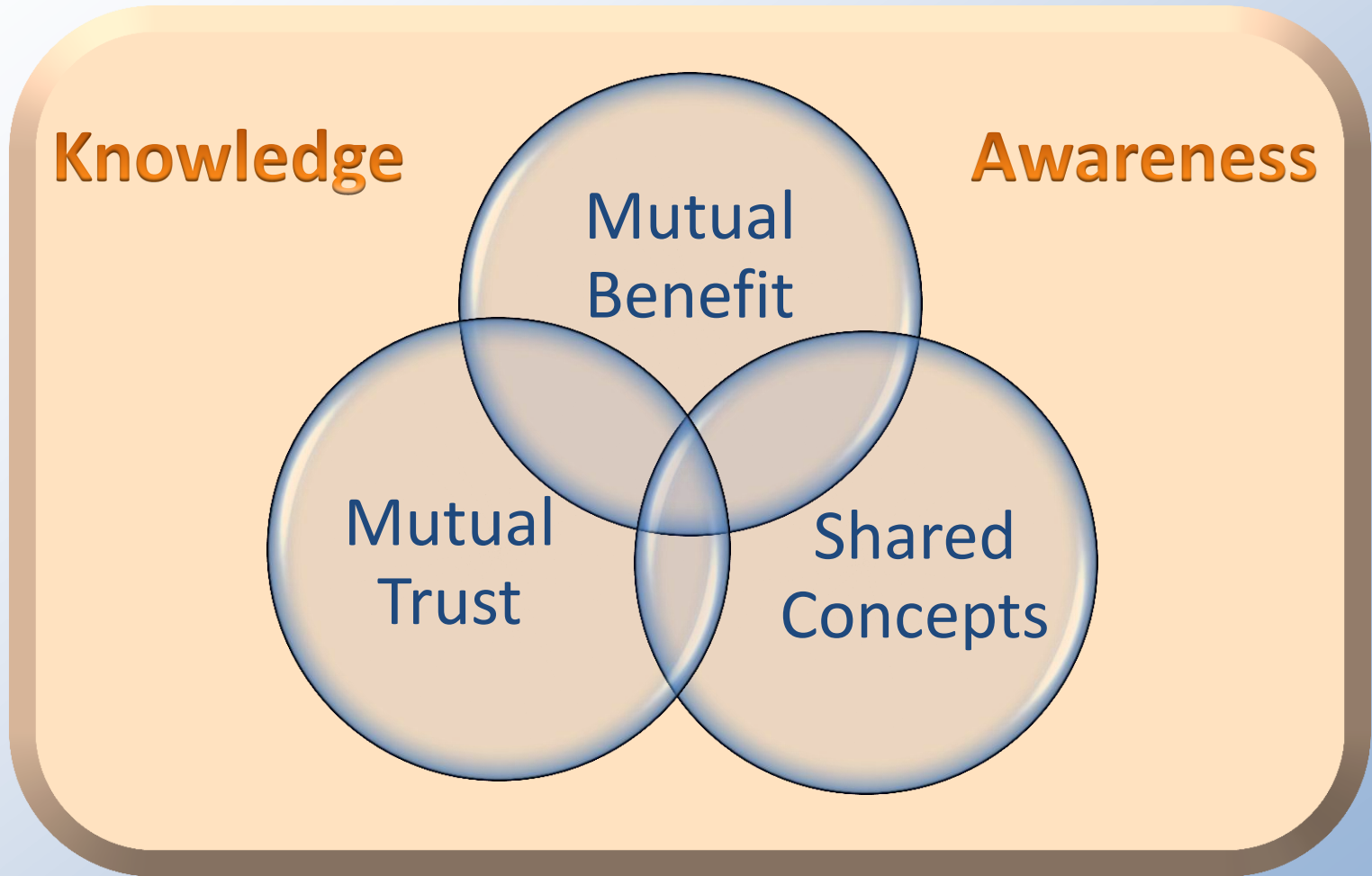

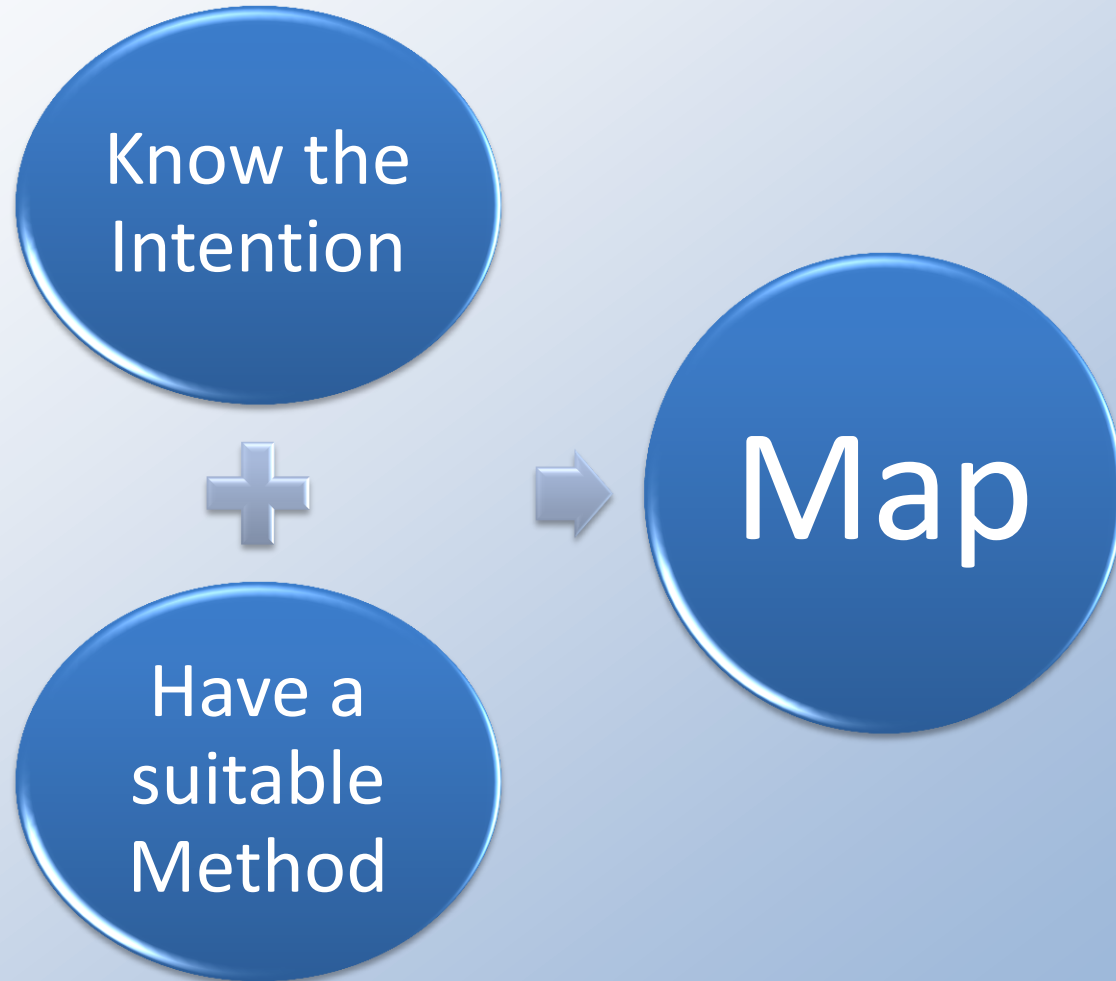

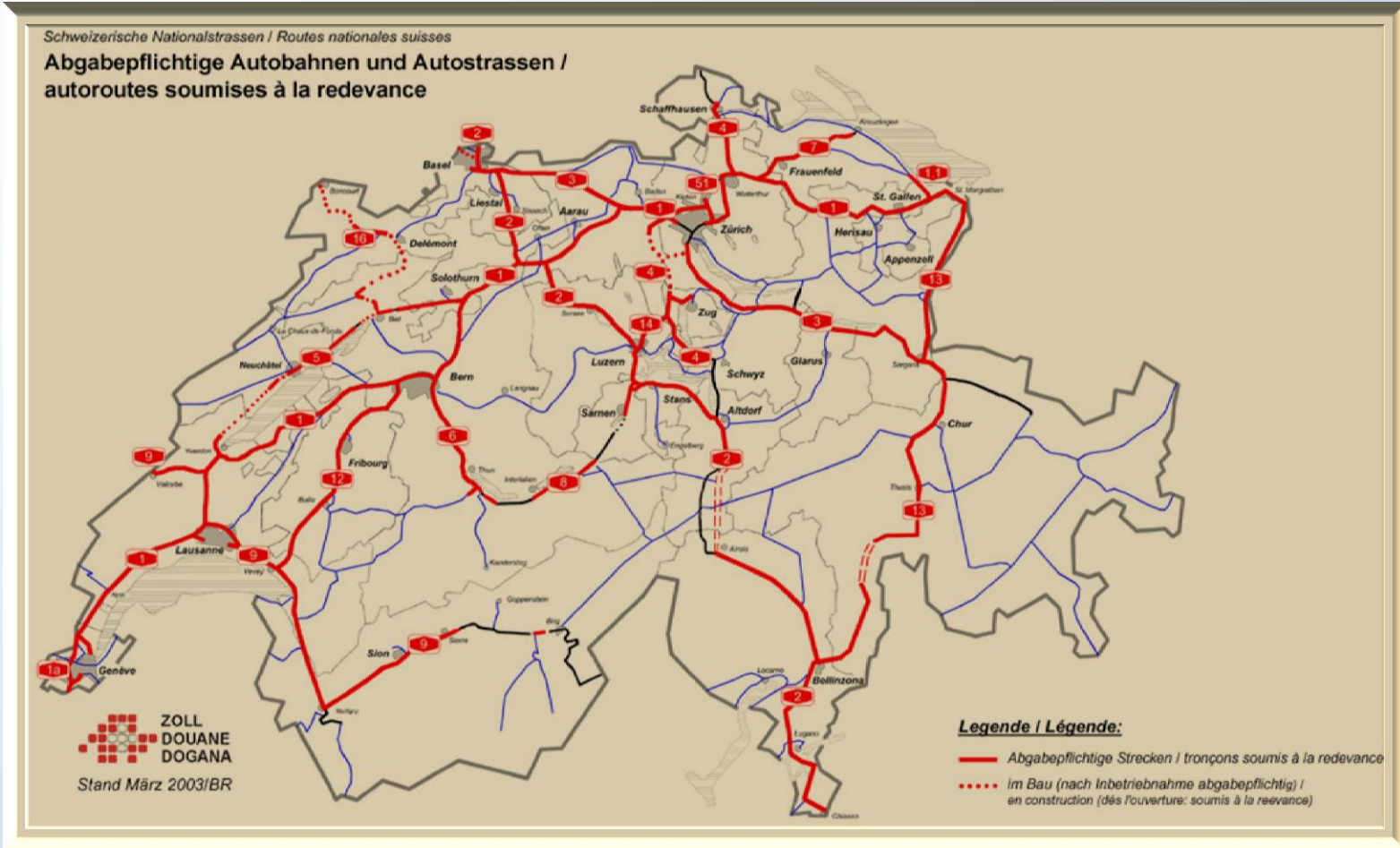

Goals and objectives of the short course

The goal of the course for science administrators is to strengthen the network and contacts to key institutions in the five countries of major interest to Swiss scientists: Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, the Philippines and Vietnam. Unlike the previous workshops and activities, this course is targeted particularly at science administrators, i.e. staff members of international/ mobility/ grant offices, tech-transfer offices, university foundations or other units dealing with the management of international research projects.

The following objectives shall be achieved:

- Mutual understanding of the role of science administration in international research projects taking into account country-specific conditions and requirements.
- Increased awareness of similarities and differences in project processes, planning and budget periods, accountabilities, reporting and evaluation requirements and other aspects of science management.
- Have a clearer idea of funding schemes offering grant opportunities for scientific collaborations between Switzerland and the above mentioned countries.
- Establish a network of key contacts in universities or research institutes of the above mentioned countries.

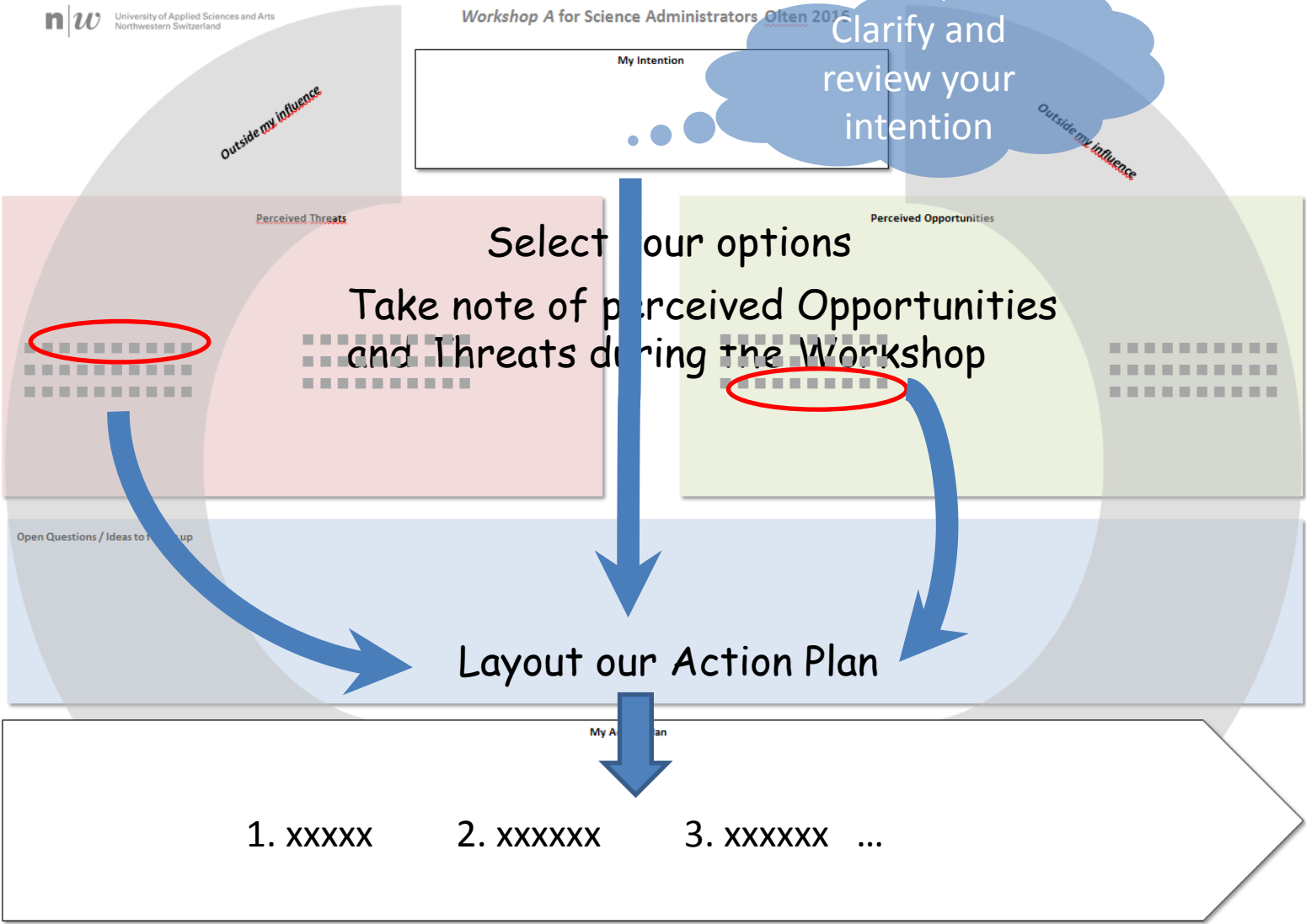
