Research Data Management at ETH Zurich

A year ago, ETH Zurich adopted its own guidelines for research data management (<u>RDM Guidelines</u>). The Executive Board put them into effect on 1 July 2022 after an ETH-wide consultation. The RDM Guidelines support researchers in their work with research data. The focus is on their optimal processing and accessibility for humans and machines according to the FAIR principles. FAIR stands for <u>F</u>indable, <u>A</u>ccessible, <u>Interoperable and <u>R</u>e-usable. The RDM Guidelines are aimed at researchers, but also guide ETH in adapting its support services and infrastructures for researchers and research groups accordingly.</u>

On behalf of the Vice President for Research, the Open Science Working Group offers an information event for researchers involved in ORD projects to provide an overview of the RDM Guidelines, the development of research data management at ETH and the support services and data infrastructures available to researchers.
