...based in Berne, Switzerland, founded 1993, 30 employees




A typical bicycle workshop in the Central Region of Burkina Faso











The typical owner is a man aged between 30 and 50, who has chosen this profession. He doesn't have any educational qualifications and hasn't completed any training with a certificate.

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







The Shop

The typical shop is in the informal sector, has a local dimension and has no branches. Bicycles and spare parts are mostly locally sourced. One third sell second—hand bicycles, another third sell only new bicycles. The main customers are young people. Only 1/2 of the shops have employees, usually 1 or 2. They usually have at least 1 apprentice.













The Needs and Costraints


The respondents recognised that they had equipment and training needs, mostly technical, rather than in the administrative or commercial aspects of the business. The main constraints are the high cost of rent, lack of space, lack of manpower, low labour productivity and difficulty in accessing credit.






Vocational Training in Bicycle Mechanics The project in a nutshell

Country & Region	Burkina Faso. Regions: Boucle du Mouhoun, Center Region, Western Central Region and the Hauts-Bassins
Start/End Dates:	1st Phase: July 2020 to December 2021 - Feasibility studies, curriculum development. 2nd Phase: 2022 - Launch phase with 350 youth. 3rd Phase: 2023 to July 2024 - Program expansion with an additional 100 to 150 youth, certification of vocational trainers and learners according to regulations of education authorities, socio-economic integration of trained youth, and impact measurement.
Beneficiaries	Direct Beneficiaries: Up to 500 youth and 300 vocational trainers, workshop owners, and vocational education commissioners. Indirect Beneficiaries: Families of the students, bicycle users.



Results as of today

Results on operational level:

- 33 DCTP-Dual Track Training Workshops created
- Training-plans and -contents developed on velomechanics and pedagogy
- 31 ToT Vocational Trainers trained
- 400 young people in dual apprenticeships
- 250 owners of small bicylce workshops trained
- Literacy training in 5 centers

Results on institutional Level:

- Validated curriculum at CQB and CQP level
- examination regulations for CQB and CQP signed
- Partnership agreement signed with ministry of education
- Examination session for 30 candidates as future Vocational Trainers





Challenges Encountered

Context of Burkina Faso:

Security situation, changing conditions, fragile conflict-prone environment.

One of the world's poorest countries. More than
 40% of the population lives below the poverty line

Realities of informal sector:

99% of businesses are organized informally.

 project needs to win the confidence of the informal sector (no lobby or minimal associative structures)

Infrastructure and equipment very basic

 broad distribution of the skills and competencies of the stakeholders


Quality of basic education:
