Mobility pricing is the concept where private transportation users (e.g. drivers) are charged fees when driving on roads/motorways (tolls) or driving into city centres (entrance fees). Mobility pricing is generally intended to reduce traffic and congestion, reducing the total number of cars on roads and motorways and spreading out travel across non-peak travel times.

Recently, the Federal Council has proposed initial steps towards mobility pricing within Switzerland. New mobility pricing schemes in Switzerland could take on different forms. Depending on how the government designs such mobility pricing, this could make a big difference to you and to Switzerland as a whole. Policy-makers thus want to know what form of mobility pricing you would support or oppose.
