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1 Background & Motivation

- > > 80% of the sub-Saharan African workforce make their living in the informal economy
- > Many vulnerable workers, such as women, youth, and migrant workers
- Precarious working conditions
- Little voice

BUT

- Informal employees remain invisible in official discourse and in government statistics
- Collective action focus on formal economy \geq
