

Progress report on the state of the doctoral dissertation

Adopted by the Department Conference of D-GESS on May 27, 2014.

According to the [detailed requirements for doctorates in the D-GESS](#) stipulated by the rector in 2009, a progress report has to be submitted to the Doctoral committee if the doctoral thesis is not completed after four years.

In order that this report will be at the disposal of the Doctoral committee on time, Doctoral student and main supervisor are reminded 3 ½ years after registration by the doctoral administration that the progress report will be due shortly. As a rule, the report should address the following questions:

- 1) What has been worked on since the research plan has been approved? Give a list of the activities.
- 2) Illustrate your adherence to the timetable set in the research plan.
- 3) What remains to be done in order to finish the dissertation?
- 4) When will you submit your dissertation at the earliest (.....) and at the latest (.....)?
No more than six months should be between both dates.
