Presenting Junior Scholars



Nate Atkinson University of Wisconsin

Nate Atkinson is an Assistant Professor of Law at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Law School. His research focuses on corporate governance, corporate misconduct, contract theory, and voting procedures. He has published in both peer-reviewed journals and student edited law reviews. Nate has previously taught courses at ETH Zurich, the University of Zurich, Northwestern Pritzker School of Law, and UCLA Law School. He holds a Ph.D. in Business from the Stanford Graduate School of Business and a J.D. from Stanford Law School.



Roy Baharad University of Chicago

Roy Baharad is a J.S.D. candidate at the University of Chicago Law School. His research focuses on the economic analysis of law. Roy's work has been published or is forthcoming in the Journal of Legal Studies, the University of Chicago Law Review, and the International Review of Law and Economics, among others. He has presented his research at the official conferences of the ALEA and the EALE. Prior to his doctoral studies, Roy studied law and economics at Bar-Ilan University and the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.



Adam Feher University of Lausanne

Adam Feher is a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Lausanne. Adam's research interest lies at the intersection of law and economics. He has worked on the economics of non-competition agreements and on regulations of online platforms. Adam gained his Ph.D. at the University of Amsterdam and Tinbergen Institute, conducting research at the Amsterdam Center for Law and Economics and Finance Group of Amsterdam Business School, under the supervision of Giuseppe Dari-Mattiacci and Enrico Perotti.


Teodora GrozaSciences Po Paris

Teodora Groza is a Ph.D. student and lecturer at Sciences Po Paris. Her research focuses on the regulation of new modes of industrial organization from an antitrust and corporate governance perspective. She has taught classes in comparative antitrust law and European internal market law. Teodora is also a research fellow for the Track Al project, an initiative co-hosted by Sciences Po Law School and CodeX, The Stanford Centre for Legal Informatics. Additionally, she is the Editor-in-Chief of the Stanford Computational Antitrust Journal.



Noam Kolt Hebrew University

Noam Kolt is an Assistant Professor at the Hebrew University Faculty of Law and School of Computer Science and Engineering. Noam leads the Governance of AI Lab (GOAL) – a cross-disciplinary research group developing technical and institutional infrastructure for safe and socially beneficial AI. During his doctorate at the University of Toronto, he was a research advisor to Google DeepMind and a member of OpenAI's GPT-4 red team. He has published in the Washington University Law Review, Berkeley Technology Law Journal, Yale Law & Policy Review, and peerreviewed venues, including NeurIPS, ACM FAccT, and Science.



Heidi LiuGeorge Washington University

Heidi Liu is Associate Professor of Law at the George Washington University Law School. Using experimental and statistical methods, Heidi studies how people develop an understanding of the law and legal processes, and she designs new procedural interventions grounded in behavioral science. Her work appears in the Journal of Legal Studies, the Southern California Law Review, and the Harvard Business Review. She received her A.B. in Economics from Harvard College and her J.D. and Ph.D. in Public Policy from Harvard University.

Presenting Junior Scholars



Lucy Msall University of Chicago

Lucy Msall is a Ph.D. candidate in Economics at the University of Chicago's Booth School of Business and a Master of Legal Studies graduate from the University of Chicago Law School. Prior to graduate school, she worked at the Congressional Budget Office and the National Bureau of Economic Research. Lucy's research focuses on tax policy, regulation, and household finance. Her ongoing projects examine possible reforms to the capital gains tax base, and regulation of women's participation in clinical drug trials.



Paul OudinUniversity of Oxford

Paul Oudin is a Departmental Lecturer in Law & Finance at the University of Oxford and an External Professor at Ecole Polytechnique (France). He holds a D.Phil. in Law and an M.Sc. in Law & Finance from the University of Oxford and a Master's degree from Panthéon-Assas University (France). His main areas of interest are financial regulation, law & economics, market microstructure, quantitative finance, corporate governance, and new technologies. Prior to starting his academic career, Paul practised law in France at Vermeille & Co for four years.



Maria Lucia Passador Bocconi University

Maria Lucia Passador is an Assistant Professor of Corporate Law and Financial Markets Regulation, and Visiting Professor at the University of Notre Dame, IN. Maria Lucia attained the National Qualification as Associate Professor in May 2022. Her research interests include corporate law, corporate governance, comparative corporate law, and empirical corporate finance. For instance, her work has been published in the NYU Journal of Law & Business, the Virginia Law & Business Review, the Brooklyn Journal of Corporate, Financial & Commercial Law, and the University of Chicago Business Law Review.


