Six months after graduation, more than 80 percent of graduates have started their career in development cooperation, policy, and industry positions with a focus on sustainable development.



## Curriculum

The MAS ETH DC qualifies students to contribute to global sustainability in an inclusive world and to become decision makers in international cooperation. The programme provides a broad understanding of local and global development challenges, skills for working in interdisciplinary and intercultural teams, and the tools and methods used in organizations engaged in international

cooperation. During the eight- to ten-month on-the-job training abroad, students apply their knowledge as junior professionals in an international organization. The programme is international and designed for graduates from all disciplines: from the natural and engineering sciences to the humanities and social sciences.

### Courses

The courses during the first study semester impart basic theoretical and empirical knowledge about social, economic, political and environmental development processes. The five compulsory courses cover the five dimensions of sustainable development. Elective courses offer students the opportunity to study selected topics in-depth.

#### 1. Compulsory courses

- Cultural and Social Aspects of Develop-
- **Development Economics**
- Politics and Governance
- History and Forms of International Cooperation
- **Environment and Resources**

#### 2. Elective courses

- Food Security and Agriculture
- Water, Sanitation and Waste
- Health and Health Systems
- Justice and Normative Aspects
- Applied Statistical Analysis and Policy Evaluation



In addition, a number of workshops prepare students for the on-the-job training: from project cycle management, working in intercultural teams, personal resilience, to participatory methods for community engagement.

During the second study semester, students build on the experience gained during the onthe-job training abroad and expand their project management skills as well as knowledge for policy in sustainable development. These block courses in the final semester are open to MAS students as well as experienced development experts from the ETH CAS DC programme, providing ample professional networking opportunities. # On-the-job training abroad

(8-10 months)

NADEL organizes on-the-job trainings around the world. Students work as junior professional officers and get to know the complex reality of development work. For students from high-income countries, the on-the-job training takes place in a low- or middle-income country. For students from low- and middle-income countries, the on-the-job training takes place in Switzerland.

The duration of the on-the-job training is eight to ten months. NADEL cooperates with

30 renowned development organisations including the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC), Swiss Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO), Caritas, Swiss Red Cross, Helvetas Swiss Intercooperation, Swisscontact, Swiss TPH, SolidarMed, Biovision, Friedrich Ebert Foundation, Terre des Hommes, the World Bank or UN organizations. The travel expenses and a contribution to living costs on-site as well as additional insurance coverage are financed by the SDC.

## Studying at NADEL

Since its foundation in 1970, NADEL has trained more than 1500 development professionals, many of whom having taken up leadership roles in international development organisations: from governmental institutions, multilateral organizations, NGOs, universities to the private sector. Teaching at NADEL is evidence-based and combines theory and practice. The learning environment encourages participants to engage, question, share and grow. Feedback

from students and experts on international cooperation is used to continuously update the study programme. Students receive individual support and thorough preparation for their onthe-job training around the world. Former MAS students are available as mentors.
