Cyber 9/12 Strategy Challenge

Kick-Off Event

Have you ever wondered what it feels like to be under a large-scale cyber attack? Now is your chance to find out!

The GCSP Cyber 9/12 Strategy Challenge in Geneva is a student competition in which teams respond to a major cyber incident that affects a key part of Europe's critical infrastructure. It challenges the teams to respond to a realistic and evolving cybersecurity scenario by analyzing the threats posed to national, international, and private sectors and coming up with a real-world response plan in a limited amount of time. Over two days, students will present and defend their solutions and have the unique opportunity to interact with expert mentors and cybersecurity professionals.

"CyberGroup - ETH Student Initiative" will provide you with training sessions led by experienced coaches and support you before and during the challenge. Furthermore, we will cover all expenses!
