From December 2020, I am working in the group of Dennis Hofheinz as a Postdoc. My research focuses on provably secure design of cryptographic protocols and their underlying cryptographic primitives. I studied Mathematics at Charles University in Prague (Czechia) and recently completed my Ph.D. in Applied Cryptography at TU Darmstadt (Germany). I am grateful that I could join ETH as a Postdoc and I am very much looking forward to hiking in the beautiful Swiss mountains.

I have been active in the area of equality in computer science for several years, so the mission of CSNOW is very close to my prior activities.
