RACKlette

RACKlette is a team of students at ETH supervised by professor Torsten Hoefler. This year, they are competing in the Student Cluster Competition (SCC) in St. Louis, Missouri (Nov 14–19). The SCC is an international competition where teams build a supercomputer from scratch and compete against one another.

The team, who is supported by ETH and the <u>CSCS</u>, is currently looking for motivated students in their **Bachelor's** program. Visualizing the Gender Content Gap Worldwide

Today there is a content gap in what is reported about women and men. Media reports in Switzerland, for example, are 75% about men. The ETH Media Technology Center works together with Ringier to create a global tool to visualize, understand and act on this gender content gap worldwide.

The **EqualVoice-Factor developed by Ringier** automatically analyzes the gender gap in the text and titles of their publications. Based on this factor, we want to build a virtual globe that makes this data consumable on a global level for the first time. The globe will visualize the gender content gap around the world and its change over time.

The joint project is an excellent showcase of how computer science can help surface inequalities in the coverage of men and women in media. To build the system, we are still looking for helping hands (e.g., through a paid "Hilfsassistent"-Job).
