It is recalled from the Ordinance on Doctoral Studies, the Ordinance governing scientific employees, and the Guidelines for research integrity and good scientific practice at the ETH, that:

- The objectives of doctoral studies are (i) to enable the doctoral student to acquire knowledge and skills in the field of the doctoral thesis, related disciplines and interdisciplinary areas, and (ii) to integrate the doctoral student into the scientific community.
- To the best of their abilities, the supervisor shall support the doctoral student in his/her effort to become an independent researcher.
- Doctoral students shall work for a minimum of 70% of their working time on their dissertation, the underlying research project and their doctoral studies.
- The supervisor ensures that the doctoral student is provided with sufficient supervision and materials and premises during the estimated duration of the project.
- The doctoral student must submit a written annual report on the progress of his/her work to the supervisor, and the supervisor provides immediate written feedback.
- Doctoral students are employed on a full-time basis, i.e. 100%.
- In cases of serious disagreement between the supervisor and the doctoral candidate, the head of the department will attempt to settle the dispute amicably.

With the exception of external theses, the supervisor guarantees that the doctoral student receives a remuneration (salary, stipend, fellowship, etc.) in accordance with the Ordinance governing scientific employees. This commitment to funding shall be valid until the date of thesis submission to the co-examiner. In exceptional cases (e.g. unsatisfactory performance), the commitment to funding may be terminated prematurely by the supervisor after written approval through the head of the department.
