The 5th ETH Workshop on Democracy, in collaboration with CEPR, will take place at ETH Zurich **on Thursday 9th and Friday 10th of June, 2022.** The workshop is organized by the Chair of Macroeconomics: Innovation and Policy and aims to:

- present leading theoretical approaches to model Politics,
- present cutting-edge theoretical analyses of Political Economy problems,
- explore new forms of democracy.


