¹ All newly introduced courses have to be approved by the teaching committee (Unterrichtskommission (UK)) and by the department conference D-PHYS.

² All new lecturers/supervisors also need a teaching assignment (Lehrauftrag), except elected ETHZ professors (including SNF/ERC professorships and guest professors). Teaching assignments may be mentored by ETHZ professors (including SNF/ERC professorships and adjunct professors).

⁴ D-PHYS can decide on additional persons authorized to teach service, core and compulsory courses. The director of studies decides on requests handed in to the course scheduling.
