

Guidelines on Authorships of the Grassland Sciences group

- The first author of a paper is the person who wrote the paper.
- Co-authorships are based on intellectual involvement.
- No honorary authorships are given.
- Potential co-authors should be contacted as early as possible (maybe even before data are collected) to avoid bad feelings at a later stage.
- A co-authorship is justified, if data sets or data analyses represent a major part of a paper.
- In certain cases, data sets are provided freely (e.g., met data, raw data) or are available in open-access data bases (e.g., flux data), maybe no co-authorship is expected. To clarify such cases, communicate openly to the data provider.
- If the PI(s) or the advisor(s) are not involved in a certain (typically additional) project, Ph.D. students can publish on their own.
